Transfer students with more than 12 hours of transferable credit do not need to submit a high-school transcript unless requested by the Office of Undergraduate Admission. Students with fewer than 12 hours of transferable college credits will be considered first-year students and should follow instructions for first-year student applicants.

- Submit references—give the forms provided to the appropriate person (non-relative).
- Send final transcript upon end of studies at previous institution.

Special instructions and required materials

International Applicants

- International students may apply online or complete a paper application, and submit the Financial Resources Statement (available on North Park's web site), and copy of current bank statement.
- SAT or ACT or TOEFL scores are helpful but optional.
- Photocopy of current passport and visa, if applicable.
- Documents should be in English whenever possible. If an adequate translation is not provided, the student may be assessed a translation fee. International transcripts may be evaluated by an independent company at the expense of the student.
- Submit references—give the forms provided to the appropriate person (non-relative), along with a stamped return envelope.

Homeschooled Applicants

Second Degree-Seeking Students

Students who have already earned a bachelor's degree, including a previous degree from North Park University, may apply for the purpose of earning a second bachelor's degree. Students should submit the undergraduate application to the Office of Admission, arrange for submission of transcripts showing all previous college or graduate work, and a copy of their diploma. The only financial aid available is the possibility of federal student loans, if still eligible.

Non-Degree-Seeking/Visiting Students

Non-degree-seeking students studying during the regular academic year (Fall - Spring) must complete the first page of the regular application and sign the final page. May take up to 30 credit hours. Submit to the Office of Undergraduate Admission, along with a \$200 tuition deposit.

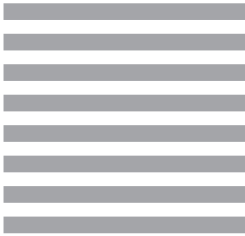
